## APPLICATIONS INVITED

Applications for the position of Camp Counselor/Staff are being sought from current UA students, as well as music teachers. Graduate and undergraduate music majors and teachers are encouraged to apply. Non-music majors will be given full consideration for employment, especially those who actively participate in ensembles, courses and private study in the School of Music. The application deadline is March 12, 2010.

Duties of Counselors and Staff: All counselors will live in the dorm and chaperone a floor (or half of a floor). Other duties will be assigned based on camp need in the following areas: attendance at ensemble rehearsals, errands of all types, sectional rehearsals, performing in an ensemble, coaching a chamber ensemble, accompanying, assisting with classes and general supervision of students while they are on campus.
